The sheet can be used as a guide or devotional and comes with some ideas of developing this beyond your window.



Each day there will be a suggestion of where you can read the context and more of the story in the bible




The crowds cut down palm branches and laid them on the ground before him shouting "Hosanna in the highest!"

You can read the story in: Matthew 21:1-11

You can read the story in: Matthew 26: 17-30

You can read the story in: Matthew 28:1-10
